## **FEDERAL UPDATES**

## FAA Administrator Hearing

On Oct. 4, U.S. Senator Maria Cantwell (D-Wash.), Chair of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation, convened a nomination hearing to consider Michael Whitaker, President Biden's nominee as the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Administrator.

Whitaker is Biden's second FAA nominee. Last year, the president nominated Denver International Airport's CEO Phillip Washington, who withdrew as a candidate for the top FAA job after facing opposition. One of the concerns was his lack of aviation background.

On the other hand, Whitaker has had a long career in aviation in the U.S. and abroad, including three years as the FAA's deputy administrator during the Obama Administration.

## FAA Reauthorization Extended Through Year End

The hearing came after Congress narrowly missed a government shutdown and the expiration of the current legislation authorizing the FAA. A last-minute agreement passed the House and Senate with overwhelming bipartisan majorities and signed by the president funds the government through Nov. 17 and extends the statutory authorities of the FAA through Dec.31.

This stop-gap measure gives Congress more time to complete FY 2024 appropriation bills and the reauthorization of the FAA.

In July, the House of Representatives approved a five-year FAA bill with a 351-69 bipartisan vote, providing \$20 billion over five years for Airport Improvement Program grants, a 19% increase from the previous multi-year FAA measure.

The Senate proposal stalled in committee in June, with an area of contention concerning pilot training. While it is still to be determined if the Senate has made progress, Cantwell said at Whitaker's hearing she hopes to finalize aviation legislation and see it enacted by the end of the year.

## FAA Approves PFAS-Free Foam for Airports

The FAA has <u>authorized</u> airports to use firefighting foam that does not contain per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), known as forever chemicals. This announcement is a crucial step to protect drinking water and public health.

Civilian airports will no longer be compelled to use PFAS-laden foam. This milestone will help to ensure that the Pentagon meets the 2024 deadline Congress set for ending PFAS foam at military bases.
